L.O.C. Frequently Asked Questions:

Q. When I enroll at LOC does that mean I'm no longer enrolled at my home school?

A. Students remain enrolled in their home school district during their enrollment and participation in the Learning Opportunities Center at OIC.

Q. Will I miss out on all the extracurricular activities at my home school?

A. Students may continue to participate in all extracurricular activities offered by their home school district.

Q. When I graduate, do I get a LOC diploma or a diploma from my home school?

A. Students will receive a diploma from their home school district upon completion of graduation requirements and a certificate of completion from LOC.

Q. Will I get a separate set of LOC grades on my transcript?

A. Grades received while enrolled in the Learning Opportunities Center Program are reflected on the student's home school district transcript.

Q. At my home school, class sizes are large and lack the individual instruction that I need as a student. Will LOC be able to help me?

A. The Learning Opportunities Center offers a low student/teacher ratio providing individualized attention for students who may require extra help or guidance.

Q. I've heard that LOC can schedule classes around my work schedule, is this true?

A. At LOC we feel that until you graduate, school needs to come first. So, although we will make every effort to help you coordinate your school and work schedule, we will expect your employer to understand that getting your diploma is the first priority.

Q. Will LOC still help me after I graduate.

A. Absolutely. OIC is a CAA, a Community Action Agency. We have job training programs including Forklift and Logistics Training. You are welcome to come back and speak with a LOC staff member you may already know about these opportunities. OIC has other resources as well, so contact us any time and we can find you the right help.
